

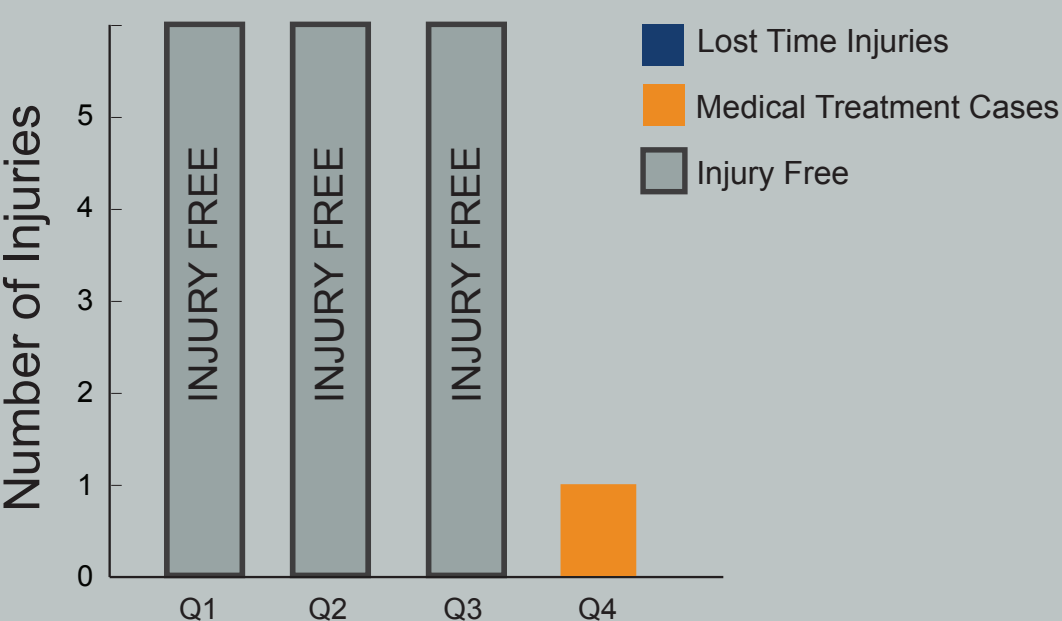

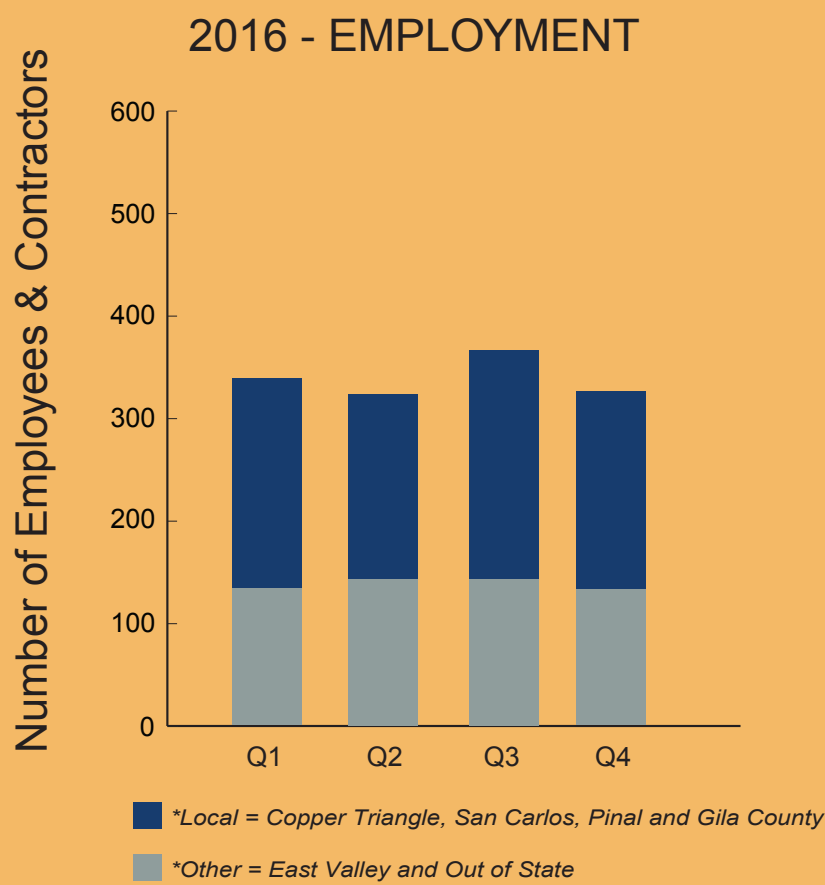
KEEPING OUR WORKFORCE SAFE

Reclamation and Rehabilitation

We continue to make remarkable progress in reclaiming the historic Magma Mine site. In 2016, the teams safely rehabilitated 35 acres of mine impacted soils. The next phase of reclamation will be completed in 2017 including revegetation in clean soil.

The work is being undertaken by local contractors Oddonetto Construction of Globe and Superior Environmental of Superior.

In collaboration with the Community Working Group (CWG), a community monitoring program will commence in Quarter 1 of 2017. The program will be driven by the CWG to track environmental and local impacts to the surrounding area.

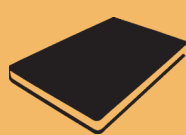
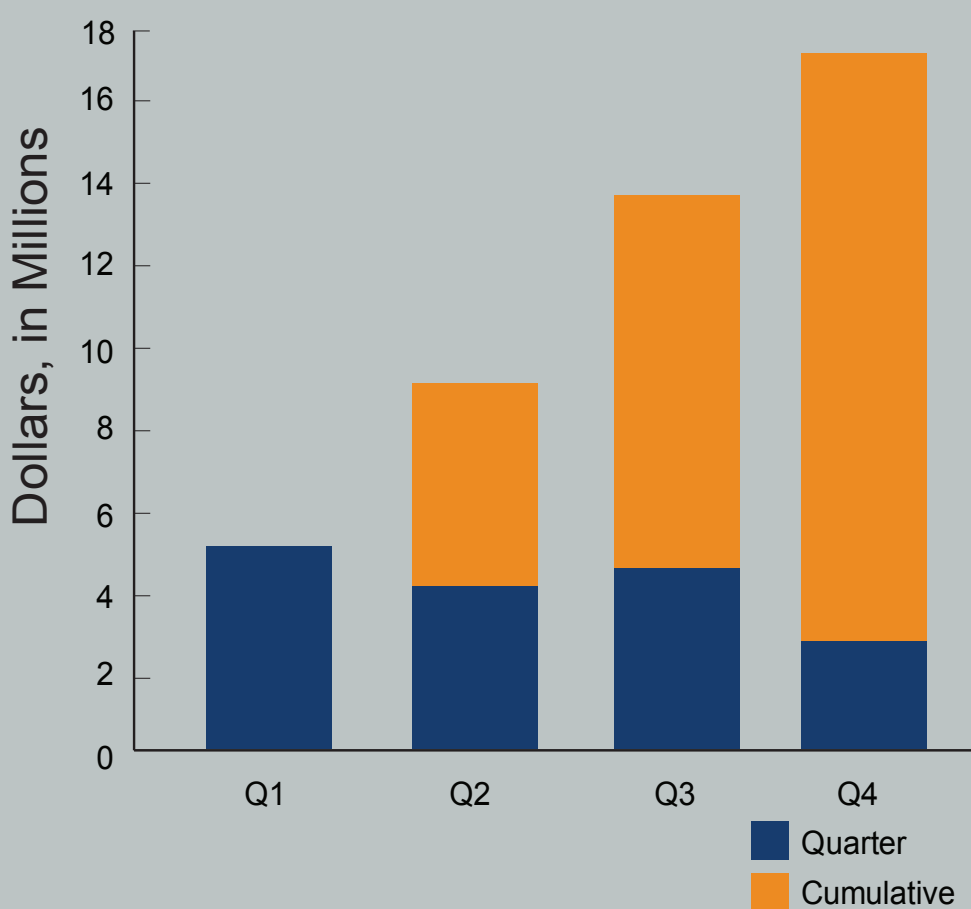
CWG of Superior hired Southwest Groundwater consultants to conduct independent testing of groundwater quality.

2016 - DOLLAR SPEND WITH LOCAL BUSINESS

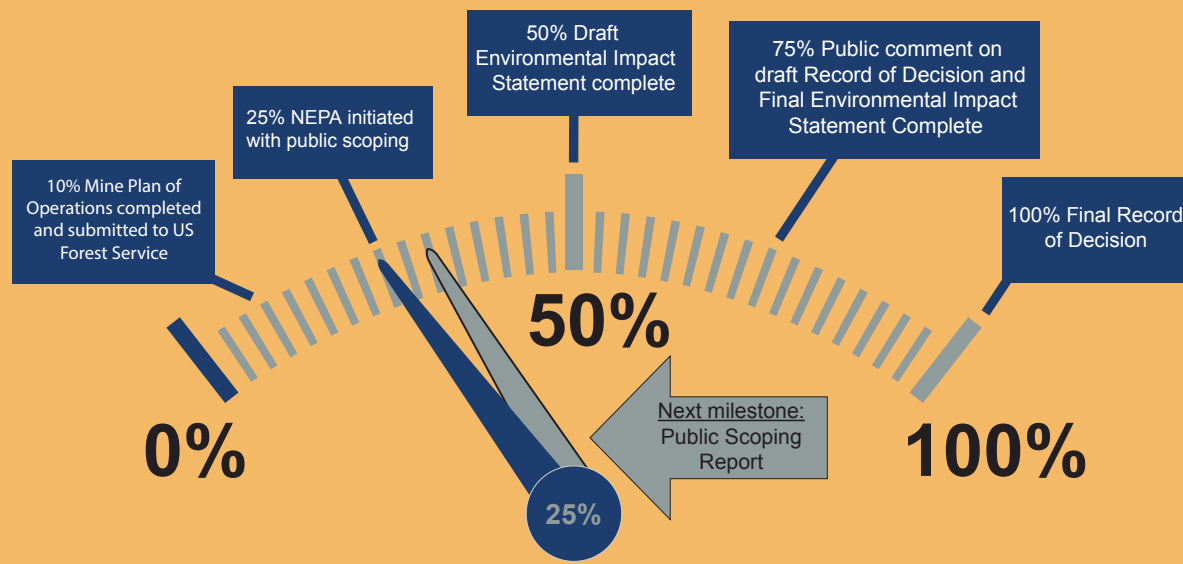


PERMITTING

EIS scoping is complete under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Issues identified during scoping are being analyzed by the U.S. Forest Service in order to shape the formal environmental review. Additional information may be obtained at resolutioncopper.eis.us.

Separately, a public scoping was initiated on the Apache Leap Special Management Area. An environmental analysis (EA) level of NEPA will be completed before the Special Management Area can be finalized in 2017.
